 - a. Update from General Manager David Odom (<u>dodom@denaircsd.org</u>) of Denair Community Services District (DCSD); 209-585-8078
 - DCSD is currently working with a Developer (69 homes off Monte Vista) that will be required to drill a new Municipal Water Well for the District to help provide water for the new development. The District's Engineer is currently working with the Developer's Engineer on the Site and Well Design. The well will most likely be located inside the district's yard across from the district's office on Gratton Road and Kersey Road. Nothing is guaranteed and no agreements have been officially signed at this time.
 - The currently proposed (smaller) developments for Denair will be able to use the current Water & Sewer capacities as they are not a large draw to the system.
 - DCSD has 4 deep wells that currently provide water to the district. If all 4 wells were operational, and without a power outage or fire flow requirements, the district has more than enough water for the current Denair customers and could supply water to hundreds more. However, DCSD is required to take all things (potential fire flows, power outages, offline well for repairs) into consideration when looking at real life capacity. The new water well that the district is going to be adding to the system will help provide water in anticipation of the next few developments that could be built in Denair. DCSD pumps can produce a maximum of 5,400 gallon per minute or 7.7 million gallons per day (MGD).
 - DCSD sewer capacity is defined, and expansion is limited. DCSD has an agreement with the City of Turlock from which DCSD's sewer capacity is purchased. DCSD chose to purchase well over the required sewer discharge demand with the City of Turlock which has resulted in enough capacity for an additional 1,000-1,500 future homes, if needed. DSCD sewer capacity is 1.1 MGD; the district currently uses only 25%-40% of this capacity on average throughout the year.
