I. Opening and Pledge of Allegiance

- A. Billy Myers called meeting to order at 7:00 PM and led the pledge to the flag.

II. Introduction and Roll Call

- A. Members present: Billy Myers, Kimberly Stokes, Tom Lindquist, James Brugger, Mary Ann Riner

III. Public Comment

- A. Kim Stokes mentioned her family had three punctured tires on local roads. One of which was most likely from the subdivision construction on Tuloumne.
- B. James Brugger provided an update from Public Works on last month's inquiry regarding flooding on Fresno.
- i. Public Works has been having issues with a dewatering pump in the area. They are working on it.

IV. Approval of Minutes from December 3, 2019

- A. December 3, 2019 meeting minutes were approved.

V. Agency Reports and Updates

A. Public Safety:

i. California Highway Patrol – Officer Moore

- a. Reports for the month included two vehicles blocking the roadway and three collisions, including a vehicle vs. big-rig at Monte Vista and Waring.

ii. Stanislaus County Sheriff – Deputy Singh

- a. There were 41 calls for service in December, which is lower than average.
- b. The Sheriff's Department is working on making their crime mapping system easier to find on the website.
- c. A comparison of calls among Denair, Empire and Keyes for the year revealed that Denair had the lowest number of calls; 1400, 2100 and 2400, respectively. Property crimes and burglaries are higher and violent crimes are lower. Overall, calls for service have been decreasing over the past five years.

iii. Denair Fire Department – See attached report

B. State and County:

i. County Supervisor Office – Patrick Cavanah/Erica Inacio

- a. The Office of Emergency Services received \$500,000 from the State to mitigate life/safety issues from power outages.
- b. They will be getting funding for communications infrastructure.

- c. Denair will be getting urban pavement preservation program in 2020. The project is intended to preserve and maintain residential roads.
- d. Public Works will be replacing street lights.
- e. The Quincy Road bridge at Taylor Rd. is in design and is planned for construction for 2021.
- f. Del Puerto Canyon Reservoir project to store water from the Delta-Mendota Canal environmental impact report is in public comment phase.
- g. Patrick will be moving to a new position. He introduced Erica Inacio, who will be taking his place.
- h. Point-in-time counts will be starting. Housing and Urban Development counts people experiencing homelessness in the County. The count will help the County obtain state funding for homeless services.
 - In 2019, Denair had three homeless. They would like neighbors to volunteer to help with the counts.
- i. The County's MAC website is in the works. MAC members, agendas and minutes will be available.

C. Local:

- i. Public Library – Paden Hardy
 - a. The Library was slow in December, but they had consistent participation in crafts and chess club.
 - b. Story Time will be starting back up.
- ii. **Denair High School Leadership – Stefany Flores**
 - a. Winter Formal will be on January 10th at the Middle School gym.
 - b. The FFA pancake breakfast will be on January 25 from 8-12
 - c. The next home basketball game is on the 22nd.
- iii. **Denair Unified School District – Dr. Terry Metzger, Superintendent**
 - a. Yesterday was a staff professional development day. The focus was on wellbeing.
 - b. There will be a District Advisory Committee meeting on Tuesday the 14th.
 - c. The charter renewal for DECA is in process for June.
 - d. Congratulations to Melissa Treadwell, who was nominated as an “Employee Making a Difference” at the County level.
