1. Call Meeting to Order: 6:33PM-By Vice Chair-Nancy Osmundson

6. Community Reports
 - A. Public Safety
 - a. California Highway Patrol: Officer Moore: From Sac. Training and was receptive to Valley Home Information. (Ms. Osmundson-Reported her accident at Hwy 126-120. (Jessica C. asked about public safety and active shooter training for public school protection.) Questions and discussions were held for public school safety and procedures for crisis. (Mr. Denis asked for more patrol in the Valley Home areas. Mr. Kyle said that there will be more police units on patrol. A complaint will be submitted by Officer Kyle. It was asked by the public how many units are placed in each area by Jessica C. (It is based on a formula of the amount of traffic as per officer Kyle.)
 - b. Sheriff's Department: Deputy Cody Cheary: June report: 4 calls of info. on speeding, mental illness and suspicious person checks, death investigation, one family fight, residential theft all in this area. There is crime/theft in the area, and it is on the rise. The community resources unit is investigating the illegal marijuana operation on Cleveland. This area is patrolled, by his unit in: Valley Home, La Grange and Knight's Ferry.
 - c. Fire Chief: Dough Rice-Battalion Chief_4th July was fine- Knights Ferry Engine in the Reservoir area and no significant events transacted. There were trash fires. It was mentioned that the local fire academy graduated three people are newly staffed.

B. Superintendent-Not present.

C. Public Works – Mr. Bill Martins; 2024-Plans (Pioneer bridge.) 60 percent of the bridge to get the construction ready-95percent will be done in 4-6 months out before the project is ready. 10 months until ready- 2024 it will begin. Acre Road- Other project- no parking signs on Minnesota are being reviewed, no action will be taken for Minnesota rd. Walkway on Minnesota for school kids will be considered.

D. Supervisor -Buck Condit: Money for the sidewalk ways. There needs to be money allocated. Possible sidewalk/walkway for the kids on rainy days and for safety.

Mosquito issues in the Oakdale/VH Area. There have been complaints. Supervisor Condit said for people to call and advise of the Mosquito abatement for treatment. Winnie said that there are mosquito problems in the immediate Valley Home area.

A. America Rescue Funds Act Workshops – As per Ms. Inacio, \$50 mil for infrastructure improvements were allocated for county pockets and unincorporated areas; several workshops to get community feedback on how to best use these funds were held, including one in Oakdale.
